Mollie sent pictures of her creating a huge rainbow for the farm gates. She wanted everyone to see it. It is beautiful, Thank you Mollie.






When they had a heifer dehorned, Jenny told everyone "You can make windows out of cow horn. I

As well as working on her spelling and maths, Perse has


been able to perfect her artistic skills to create this brilliant picture. The details are excellent Perse, Well done.
